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Dane County Drug Court Treatment Program

The Drug Court Treatment Program (DCTP) is a single court to which non-violent drug offenders are referred for voluntary participation in a comprehensive rehabilitation program. The goals of the DCTP are to help people recover from addictions while reducing incarceration and criminal justice costs for defendants who present a low risk to public safety. Through participation in DCTP, defendants participate in alcohol and drug treatment and other services under the close supervision of the drug court judge to reduce dependency to alcohol and drugs and to change criminal lifestyles.

A case manager is assigned to each participant and is responsible for guiding participants through their recovery while using the structure of the drug court for support of that goal. In 2011, Dane County Department of Human Services contracted with three different agencies to provide case management as well as several other community agencies to provide access to treatment for participants.

The Mission of the Dane County Drug Court Treatment Program is:

The Dane County Circuit Court recognizes that a majority of crimes committed in Dane County are committed by people with substance abuse problems. We believe that in order to reduce this problem, it is necessary to provide offenders with an opportunity to participate in a program that will provide treatment and interventions to assist them with their substance abuse problems. This program will offer educational and employment linkages so that with these tools, participating defendants will possess the ability to become productive members of our community.

The following report details some of the outcomes achieved by the Dane County Drug Court Treatment Program in 2011 and in all the years the court has been operating. The court team, the case managers, treatment providers, and most of all the DCTP participants themselves worked hard to achieve this mission.

KEY FINDINGS

Successful Completion Rate

One demonstration of how effective the Dane County DCTP is in helping participants achieve sobriety and end their criminal lifestyle reflected in the Successful Completion Rate. A participant successfully completes Drug Court by doing all of the following:

- Completing treatment
- Making progress toward and/or achieving goals
- Having a post-graduation plan approved by the assigned case manager and the Drug Court Team
- Having no relapses for 120 consecutive days
- Being in Phase Three for about 90 days

A participant who meets all of these criteria is eligible for graduation and is counted as a successful completion. Participants who successfully complete drug court are much more likely to have positive outcomes than their counterparts who leave drug court early or do not participate at all.

National Drug Court Completion Rate: Average: 45%; Range: 26% - 77% ¹

Dane County Drug Court Completion Rate: 66% (1996 – 2011)²; 84% (2011 only)

There is minor variation in the completion rate among different racial groups and genders. The successful completion rate for African-American participants, the largest racial minority group represented, is 63%. The successful completion rate for Caucasian participants is 67%. The successful completion rate for men (65.6%) is virtually identical to that of women (65.9%).

Recidivism

Another key indicator of the success of drug courts is whether past participants end the criminal lifestyle that landed them in the program in the first place.

National Two-Year Arrest-Free Rate of Drug Court Graduates: 75%³

Dane County Two-Year Arrest-Free Rate of Drug Court Graduates: 65%⁴

Dane County's two-year arrest free rate decreased from 78% in 2010 to 65% in 2011. It is difficult to draw conclusions from yearly fluctuations.

In an earlier review conducted on all participants through 2001, re-arrest rates were gathered for the 161 graduates who had been out of the program between 12 and 48 months. In this review 76% of those graduates had remained crime free. The crime-free rate for a comparable group of 99 participants who were discharged other than by graduation was found to be 46%. The crime-free rate for a second comparison group comprised of 155 individuals referred to the DCTP by the District Attorney's Office, but declined to participate despite being eligible, was calculated to be 55%. The average number of new criminal arrests per offender was found to be 67% lower for DCTP graduates than for non-completers and 60% lower for graduates than decliners.

Policy Change

In July 2011 the Dane County DCTP changed its admission policy to accept only those charged with a felony. This change was made for two primary reasons: 1) Research indicates that participants with felony charges did better in the drug court model than those with lesser offenses. 2) Other studies indicate that participants who are admitted within twenty days of arrest fare better in treatment. Restricting the referral criteria reduces the number of people referred to DCTP, consequently reducing the wait time from arrest to plea.

Other Societal Benefits

As a result of DCTP graduates obtaining sobriety and leading a crime-free lifestyle, there are several other benefits associated with the drug court program. The following are just a few of those benefits realized by all discharged participants, as calculated from the inception of the DCTP:

- 35% (428 participants) obtained either full or part time employment.
- 60% (739) were able to retain their employment.
- 42 drug-free babies have been born to active DCTP participants.
- 30 parents became reunited with their minor children.
- 37 parents resumed child support payments.
- 28 parents became current with child support payments.
- 73 parents continued child support payments.

Historical Data

The balance of this report includes tables containing information that has been collected since the inception of the Dane County DCTP. All 1996 data represents partial-year information as the DCTP began operation in June 1996.
